**Principal's Report:**

- Thank you for the teacher dinners - they really help boost morale for the teachers and staff. An extra thanks to Allison Armstrong for all of her work.
- The school is anticipating the Focus Oct.1 Report from the district, which details the FTE funding based on the number of students. The school projected 602 students, and the current enrollment is 605, so the school is on track. The school wants to keep growing with a goal of 620 students.
- Proficiency Based Grading leadership team will be meeting soon, and Churchill's goal is to be on track with implementation and to communicate effectively with parents. The school is providing PBG education to teachers and will monitor what is working and what needs to be improved. A suggestion was made by an attendee to make the use of PBG more consistent across all teachers.
- An assembly on Cyber Safety will be held tomorrow for all students. Parents are welcome to attend. The former Netsmarts program was dropped by the district.
- Club announcements will go out after school today.
- School security: Churchill is on the agenda for a district security assessment. A safety review occurs quarterly. All doors are currently locked during the school day, except for the two main doors and the ramp door (for accessibility). The recent Shelter In Place incident went well - notifications working. Shelter In Place refers to a community incident, all outside doors are locked and school proceeds as usual.
