

One perk of volunteering frequently at school with the PTSA is getting to know the wonderful people who work with our students every day. These people truly care about our students. What Do You Do? My duties as a Junior High School Resource Officer (SRO) include assisting Admin with maintaining a safe environment for students. In that respect, I observe and report to Admin the things in the environment and student activities that I feel are a concern or should be rewarded. I walk the halls between classes. I try to project a friendly, approachable Police Officer presence, but also to remind students that I am a proactive presence and will not hesitate to do whatever needs to be done to protect students and the adults working at Churchill to provide them with an education.

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- What do you love at Churchill? I love coming in and greeting the students, talking to them and answering their questions. I try to memorize two new names every day..a daunting task, but I'm working at it!
- What inspired you to become a police officer? My desire to become a Detective stemmed from my ever present desire to know and do more. As I have matured in my career, I have found that working to achieve long term solutions to criminal activity and other problems in my community has brought me much more satisfaction than the quick "collar". Both are valuable, but that's where I have focused my efforts, Community Oriented Policing.
- What is your favorite part of Churchill? My favorite part of Churchill so far has been the super supportive staff and PTSA I get to work with. The students are fantastic too!
- What is something people don't know about you? What most people don't know about me..hmm well, I have a grown son and three grandkids. I am a certified Chef from the Cordon Bleu Academy in Portland, Oregon. I have served in the Army as a Combat Field Medic and in the Air Force as a Fuel Systems Specialist on F-4 fighter jets...and been a Police Officer for over 18 and a half years.
- **Do you have any pets?** I have one pet, my sweet German Shepard Boris. He is super lovable, not nearly as scary as he looks, but don't tell anyone!
- **Do you have any questions for parents?** My only question for students and teachers would be to ask what you feel is a concern here at school and how can I help you to feel safer?
